[San Clemente City Council Signs On New Multimodal Master Plan](#)

Members of the San Clemente City Council on Tuesday voted unanimously to declare San Clemente a multimodal city through its new Circulation Element that will fully integrate the needs of bicyclists and pedestrians with the city's transportation system.

San Clemente's Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan will fully integrate with the city's updated Circulation Element in order to comply with state's Complete Streets Law, ensuring a balanced multimodal transportation system for the city.

The State's Complete Streets Law requires planning for a balanced, multimodal network, specifically accommodating children, seniors, bicyclists, pedestrians, public transit users and commercial goods movers in any Circulation Element revised beginning this month.

"I really view this as San Clemente's Complete Streets Initiative. We have a tool before us to ensure we'll take the Complete Streets legislation seriously and that, ultimately, we'll end up with a superior Circulation Element," Councilwoman Lori Donchak said. "It would be a true salute to the fact that we want multimodal experiences in San Clemente."
